UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following O R D E R

Application for anticipatory bail filed by the petitioner who is accused of committing offences punishable under Sections 420,406,467,468,471 and 120B read with 34 IPC was dismissed by the Sessions Court on 19.03.2021. The petitioner approached the Court by filing an application for anticipatory bail 26.03.2021. filed He has this writ alleging that his anticipatory bail is not being listed for hearing.The learned counsel for the

petitioner submits that the anticipatory bail application is listed at Sl. No. 3076 and it is going to take very long time for his application to be heard by the High Court. The petitioner is 72 years old and is suffering from various ailments. The justification for filing this Writ petition under Article 32 is that he might be arrested by the police even before his anticipatory bail is heard by the High Court.

are not persuaded to entertain We petition under Article 32 of the Constitution to grant petitioner as this application for relief to the anticipatory bail is pending in the High Court. However, as his application has not been taken up for the last six months, we grant interim protection to the petitioner by directing that no coercive steps shall be taken against him for a period of four weeks from today. The High Court is requested to dispose of anticipatory bail application filed the petitioner within a period of four weeks from today.

Writ petition is, accordingly, disposed of. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
